#### 3. Ink

#### Modern Calligraphy Inks:

pre-mixed inks available in a range of colors.

#### Waterproof Inks:

Low-quality or excessively diluted inks that may fade or bleed.

#### **Preparation Tips:**

- Strain handmade ink to remove impurities.
- Test the ink flow on a sample sheet before starting.
