5. Course Breakdown:

1. Mastering Advanced Techniques (CALL 401):

- This course delves deep into complex calligraphy techniques, emphasizing the mastery of intricate strokes, pen pressure control, and script variations.
- Students will explore different materials and tools, such as specialized inks and papers, and learn techniques to achieve precision and consistency in script formation.

4. Artistic Style Development (CALL 404):
